My Friends in Christ,

What an amazing summer we had here at Zion. We held VBS for the first time since the pandemic started and we took this opportunity to change our format. Instead of meeting for one week, we met weekly which enabled our outreach to families that were traveling. Instead of being a rockstar for just a week, I got to be a rockstar for 6 weeks!

We also had the opportunity to work with Breanna Myers—a seminarian at ULS completing her CPE experience. I appreciate that Zion really took her in and made sure she was able to learn and practice pastoral care. She completed her program at the beginning of August and is starting her internship on September 1. I have to admit, I really enjoyed working with Vicar Bre this summer and miss her presence around Zion.

What seminarians usually lack in ministry experience, they usually have a plethora of some really great ideas. It was great being able to share some wisdom but also hear some new wisdom!

I am grateful that we were able to be away for two weeks in August. As this pandemic continues to rage and rear its ugly head, having some time to not think about contingency plans and statistics around Covid was a real blessing. I know that being able to take two weeks off carries a certain amount of privilege that many do not enjoy, but our Lord did command us to rest and make rest a priority. Even Jesus took a nap a time or two. So, as your co-pastor, I encourage you to make sure you take a break. Kids still need to be fed, cows still need to be milked, lesson plans still need to be written, but you still matter more than all of those things.

However, I do find it a bit silly to talk about rest as we begin to start a very busy fall season. I hope you are able to participate in Syncing-In Sunday on September 12. What we have heard over the past 19 months is that many people feel that their lives are out of sync. So, we are calling this day Syncing-in Sunday because we are hoping to help everyone begin getting their faith-life back in sync. On this Sunday, we plan to share some of our hopes and plans for the next year. Breakfast and lunch will be served. At 10 a.m., we plan to talk about our Fall programing including Sunday School, adult forum topics, confirmation, youth gathering, and other ministry activities. At noon, we will have an open forum time where we want to talk about our future and where you feel the Holy Spirit is moving us. I hope you have this date on your calendar and more importantly, I hope you share an invitation with a friend or a neighbor.

Did you know that the most effective way to do evangelism is personal invitation from you? People are more likely to come to church if they know someone at the church. Studies have shown that the hardest area to overcome in regards to visitors is having them walk from their car to their seats in the sanctuary. Many of these same studies have noted that first-time visitors will not even make it halfway to the worship space because they get lost or confused inside the building. Adding greeters and signs are the some of the easiest and most effective way to help people feel welcome. However, The best way to retain visitors is for them to know someone at the particular church they are visiting In a study done in 2018, 55% of Lutherans say that they are least likely to say they've invited at least one person to church. Nationwide, church participation and membership are down across denominations, but that doesn't mean that people need God any less. It is our job to show the world how much we need Jesus.

I want you to get involved and make us a part of your routine because when you come, our community better. We sing stronger, we pray stronger, we act stronger. Without YOU, we are not complete. We have both in-person and virtual options for renewing your faith this year. Turn on the computer or come through our doors and experience the power of the Holy Spirit and this life-altering gospel.

LITURGY (From the Greek, "work of the people"); more than a set form of service or one particular service, the liturgy is the whole body of texts and music used for the worship of God.

From the Glossary of The Manual on the Liturgy, Lutheran Book of Worship written by Philip H. Pfatteicher and Carlis R. MesserIi p. 389

Lutheran churches fall under the category of liturgical churches. This means we follow a fairly regular set pattern of parts of our worship service as compared to non-liturgical churches which have a less regular or prescribed order of service. For those of us left-brained folks who like things methodically done, this is quite comforting. We know what to expect and who is doing what when we come to worship. However, there's something that those of us who like our straightforward, prescriptive, "we know what we are gonna get" worship might be missing as part of our worship experience.

The worship we do should be a collective endeavor to be gathered together as God's people, hear God's word, join in a nourishing meal of faith, and be sent out in the world to share God's love in our words and actions. When we gather together on a Sunday morning, we are doing a part of the work of being God's people. We are not just coming to the Pastor Diane and Pastor Matt Good News Hour or the Worship Band Concert or Bobby's Organ Recital. We are coming to ALL take part in a significant time where our words and our actions are giving God thanks for all God has done for us and continues to strengthen us to do the work of being God's people.

"Well Pastor, that's what I'm doing on Sunday. I don't understand why you're bringing this up. "Worshipping together on a Sunday morning takes more than just the administrative staff, pastor, or musicians. It takes many others to welcome people to the sanctuary, equip people for worship, speak the Word, usher to the Table, make sure those at home receive the Word through the internet, just to name a few of the ways worship happens. We are all invited to worship and we do, but there are elements of our worship experience where we need to help make them happen or they just do not. We need to hear different voices sharing the Word. We are such a big congregation with such a big building that we need many hands to help people know where to go, to have the bulletins they need to worship, and to receive the Lord's Supper. It is our work and we are called to make it happen each week.

It is astonishing how the work of the people has changed over time. We have gone (and in some communities this still continues!) from a home-based worship service to worshipping in elaborate churches and now even today to worshipping online. Doing the work of the people is an important part of who we are as Christians. It is a part of our calling that not only supports our immediate community but also our home-bound members, as well as people who have never heard of Jesus. Please know that Zion is a place for you to strengthen your faith but also a place where you are called to strengthen the faith of others. Please help doing so by being a worship assistant whether that is a greeter, an acolyte, a lector, an usher, a sound and technology assistant, and/or a Visitation/ Eucharistic Minister. If you have not been trained yet, please ask and we will make sure you have what you need to take part in doing your work as a person of God worshipping here at Zion. You can sign up to be a worship assistant in the sanctuary near the bulletin and Offering table or talk with one of the pastors. Let us do the work of God's people with gratitude for God's gracious love in all the we do! Amen!

How Much Does it Cost?



Since Frederick County is not under a mask mandate at this time and hospitalizations remain low, the



Middletown Evangelical Lutheran Church Zion Heritage Day Luncheon Committee



We have completed the outside renovation of the church including a new roof on the 1928 edition and the parking lot overhang as well as the repair and repainting of the exterior doors (22) of the entire building. The damaged wall on the back parking lot and the seam between the rear parking lot and sidewalk have been repaired. The Clothes Closet HVAC system is completed and functioning well and the building is now in excellent shape. The heating systems in the church building are old, but are in good condition and maintenance of the units has been completed.

As you know we have experienced an aging out of the 10 A/C units throughout the church with 8 of them out of commission and needing replacement (Sanctuary 30-ton, Music Room and offices 7.5-ton, Gardens

Edge, rear of Social Room and Archives 7.5-ton, east and west side upper classrooms 2x 3.5-ton, lower classrooms west side 3.5-ton and both Chapel units 2x 3-ton) The remaining two are functioning properly at this time, but will need replacement as well.

The Sanctuary system was installed in the 1980's and the other units installed during the 1993 renovation of the rear of the church. These units have performed way past their life expectancy and have served us very well, but it is now time to replace these units. There will be a considerable energy savings going with the new more efficient units. We have contracts on the Sanctuary system (October install) and the Music Room office area (November install) We are receiving bids on the two Chapel units and the Gardens Edge/rear Social Room unit. The remaining units we will seek bids at the end of the year for springtime installation.

While this is a costly endeavor it is a long-term energy efficient solution to our future air conditioning needs. If you want to help with this expensive undertaking, please give to the Building Fund designating for A/C.

to come and walk with others in the long journey of grief and allow healing to take place. There are three key components to your GriefShare experience.


- 1. Video seminar: videos that feature leading grief recovery experts.


