GATHERING

The assembly gathers in silence and may remain seated for the reciting of Psalm 51. Please join in unison.

INVITATION TO LENT

The assembly may either sit or kneel. The presiding minister will invite the assembly into the discipline of Lent.

CONFESSION OF SIN

P Let us confess our sin in the presence of God and of one another.

Congregation may either sit or kneel during confession.

Most holy and merciful God,

G **We confess to you and to one another, and before the whole company of heaven, that we have sinned by our fault, by our own fault, by our own most grievous fault, in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done and by what we have left undone.**

After each petition, the congregation will respond by saying:

G **Have mercy on us, O God.**

The confession continues...

P Restore us, O God, and let your anger depart from us.

G **Hear us, O God, for your mercy is great.**

P Lord, bless the sinner who asks for your forgiveness and bless † all those who receive these ashes. May they keep this lenten season in preparation for the joy of Easter. We ask this through Christ our Lord.

IMPOSITION OF ASHES

People may come forward and stand to receive the ashes. Please form two lines as you come forward. The Ministers will mark the forehead of each person with a cross of ashes, saying:

P Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return.

After those who desire ashes have received them, all may kneel or sit, and the minister continues.

P Accomplish in us, O God, the work of your salvation,

C that we may show forth your glory in the world.

P By the cross and passion of your Son, our Savior,

C bring us with all your saints to the joy of his resurrection.

P Come back to the Lord with all your heart; lave the past in ashes, and turn to God with tears and fasting, for he is slow to anger and ready to forgive. Almighty God have mercy on you, forgive you all our sins through our Lord Jesus Christ, strengthen you in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep you in † eternal life.





DISTRIBUTION OF COMMUNION

All baptized Christians are welcome to receive communion this day.. When you come forward for communion, the pastor or assisting minister will say similar words: "The body of Christ, given for you," and "The blood of Christ, shed for you." Your response to each is "Amen.". Know that Christ is fully present in the bread and the wine. If you are only able to receive one kind (such as only the host or only the wine), know that you will receive the same benefits as receiving both.

After all have returned to their places, the assembly stands. The presiding minister says a table blessing.

P The Body and Blood of our Lord, Jesus Christ strengthen you and keep you in his grace.
